OMS-III Curriculum

OMS-III rotation schedules may vary by location and preceptor as the student is expected to follow the preceptors' schedules except for required COM educational programming. Each OMS-III student is required to participate in one or more required core rotations(s) in a healthcare setting in which the student works with resident physicians in an accredited graduate medical education (GME) program. While student preferences may be taken into account at OCCE discretion, rotations are assigned based upon availability and educational requirements.

A minimum of one required OMS-III clerkship must be completed under the supervision of an osteopathic physician (DO), and more than one of the required third-year clinical clerkship experiences must include an inpatient component.

OMS-IV Curriculum

OMS-IV rotation schedules may vary by location and preceptor as the student is expected to follow the preceptors' schedules except for required COM programming. Students must be enrolled in clinical or academic activities throughout the entire academic year, up to the end of the semester as defined on the Academic Calendar.

OMS-IV Required Clerkships & Electives

4 weeks of Emergency Medicine (EM)
4 weeks of a Primary Care Selective
4 weeks of a Community/Rural/Underserved Medicine Selective (which may overlap with one of the other academic clerkship requirements)
4 weeks of a Specialty Medicine Selective
2 weeks Entrustable Professional Activities III

Electives

20+ Weeks of Electives (All OMS-IV students must be enrolled in clinical activities up to the end of the semester as defined on the Academic Calendar).

Students are required to complete a minimum of 38 credit-hours during the OMS-IV year. In general, one week of rotation (37.5 or more learning hours) corresponds with one credit-hour.
